The main bedroom includes an updated ensuite and built-in robes, with the remaining bedrooms close to the central bathroom. There's also a full laundry with outside access, which always comes in handy on acreage.

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Inside, the home has been refreshed and is light-filled throughout. Features include hardwood floors, a wood heater for the cooler months, two split systems, and a modern kitchen with soft-close cabinetry.

Outside is where this property really comes into its own.

There's a large shed (approx. 11.75m x 7.26m) with concrete floor, power and insulation - ideal for a workshop, storage or machinery. You've also got two 22,500L water tanks, a woodshed, established gardens and a selection of fruit trees already in place.

The land itself is a great mix of open areas and natural bush.

Toward the rear, the land drops away into a more secluded valley with established ferns and a network of tracks that wind through the property, well suited to bushwalking, exploring or 4WD-style adventures. The surrounding area is known to attract deer, which may appeal to buyers interested in wildlife observation or, where permitted, licensed deer hunting and land management opportunities.

A natural spring runs through the property, feeding into Arthur's Creek and adding to the appeal for those wanting a genuine connection to the land.

Wildlife is part of everyday life here, with wallabies, wombats and plenty of native birdlife around, all within easy reach of Mount Robertson State Park and Kinglake National Park for weekends outdoors.

If you've been looking for acreage with a comfortable home, usable shedding and a good balance of cleared land and bush, this is one worth a look.

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
